Contextual Analysis

Given a Roman numeral analysis, **provide a contextual analysis**. Be sure to **identify the key** and **cadence type**. The first phrase has been done for you. Answers are available on the course website in the Contextual Analysis of Chorale Phrase Harmonizations by J.S. Bach Web app.

1. "Wie schön leuchtet der Morgenstern" (How beautiful beams the morning star)
